**PARISH NEWS:**

**H1N1 PRECAUTIONS AT CHURCH:** In light of the present outbreak of the H1N1 virus, some slight changes at Mass will be happening. We ask that ALL Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion now come up to use the hand sanitizer in front of their pew at the start of the sign of peace and then not to shake hands with anyone after they have washed their hands. Then to immediately come up on the altar to be ready to distribute Holy Communion. In regards to receiving the Precious Blood, you are asked to use common sense. If you feel ill or are just getting over a cold or the flu, please refrain from receiving from the chalice. The same applies to the Sign of Peace. If you are ill or are just getting over the flu or a cold, please refrain from shaking hands at the Sign of Peace. A simple bow or smile to your neighbor in the pew will suffice. Also if someone does not wish to shake hands with you, please do not feel offended. These practices are only temporary until circumstances improve. Thank you for understanding.

**ISSUE 3:** Which will be on the ballots statewide during the upcoming November 3 election, would authorize the building of one casino facility in each of the following Ohio cities: Cincinnati, Cleveland, Columbus, and Toledo. The Catholic Conference of Ohio has opposed all previous statewide casino and slot machine initiatives. The Catholic Bishops in Ohio continue to believe casino gambling, as proposed in Issue 3, is not in the best moral, social, and economic interest of the citizens of our state. Studies have indicated that more persons and families will be seduced into financial hardship rather than would be helped and societal problems will be aggravated rather than improved. Furthermore, Issue 3 appears to be poorly written and overindulgent toward the gambling interests of private business. Because Issue 3 is a constitutional amendment, voters have no resource for fixing such concerns except to pass another constitutional amendment. This flawed casino proposal should not be enacted into our Ohio Constitution and so the Catholic Bishops of Ohio encourage voters to oppose Issue 3.
