**GOOD FRIDAY - DOWNTOWN WALKING STATIONS OF THE CROSS:** The many faces of faith and justice will be the focus of the annual **Walking Stations of the Cross**. **CREMATION AND THE CATHOLIC CHURCH:** Many people have asked about the possibility of cremation and burial in the Catholic Church. The Order of Christian Funerals, which is the document governing burial of Catholics in the United States says:  
 "Although cremation is now permitted by the Church, it does not enjoy the same value as a burial of the body. The Church clearly prefers and urges that the body of the deceased be present for the funeral rites, since the presence of the human body better expresses the values which the Church affirms in those rites. When the choice has been made to cremate a body, it is recommended that cremation take place **AFTER** the funeral Mass." It goes on to say, "The cremated remains of a body should be treated with the same respect given to the human body from which they come. This includes the use of a worthy vessel to contain the ashes, the manner in which they are carried, the care and attention to appropriate placement and transport, and the final disposition. The cremated remains should be buried in a grave or entombed in a mausoleum or columbarium. The practice of scattering cremated remains on the sea, from the air, or on the ground, or keeping cremated remains in the home of a relative or friend of the deceased are **NOT** the reverent disposition that the Church requires. Whenever possible, appropriate means for recording with dignity the memory of the deceased should be adopted such as a plaque or stone which records the name of the deceased." Hopefully this addressed the questions around this topic.
